### 729 AIRLIFT SQUADRON (AFRC)

**Lineage.** Constituted 729 Bombardment Squadron (Heavy) on 14 May 1943. Activated on 1 Jun 1943. Redesignated 729 Bombardment Squadron, Heavy on 20 Aug 1943. Inactivated on 28 Aug 1945. Redesignated 729 Bombardment Squadron, Very Heavy on 13 May 1947. Activated in the Reserve on 12 Jul 1947. Redesignated 729 Bombardment Squadron, Light on 27 Jun 1949. Ordered to Active Service on 10 Aug 1950. Redesignated 729 Bombardment Squadron, Light, Night Intruder on 25 Jun 1951. Relieved from Active Duty, and inactivated, on 10 May 1952. Redesignated 729 Tactical Reconnaissance Squadron on 6 Jun 1952. Activated in the Reserve on 13 Jun 1952. Redesignated: 729 Bombardment Squadron, Tactical on 22 May 1955; 729 Troop Carrier Squadron, Medium on 1 Jul 1957; 729 Tactical Airlift Squadron on 1 Jul 1967; 729 Military Airlift Squadron (Associate) on 25 Apr 1969; 729 Airlift Squadron (Associate) on 1 Feb 1992; 729 Airlift Squadron on 1 Apr 1993.
